



Post-Secondary Education Transition (PSET) Program Description

The Post-Secondary Education Transition (PSET) is a Virtual Scavenger Hunt for vulnerable and homeless young women of Color aged 16-21 admitted and enroll in a college, university, technical college, or any other professional training.

The Virtual Scavenger Hunt is a series of open-ended questions that help student's identify critical personnel, resources, and support services offered to so they are equip to navigate their new academic or training program.

Students will:

- Explore challenges they may face pursuing post-secondary education.
- Complete the Pre-Scavenger Hunt Questionnaire to discover how prepare they are for their transition.
- Identify their personal challenges and learn skills, behavior, and strategies to address them.
- Participate in a Virtual Scavenger Hunt, answering questions to discover critical personnel, resources, and services on their campus or within their program that are available to help them make a successful transition.

Duration: Six-weeks (does not include the Orientation)

Offered: Spring, after school during the academic year

Day & Time: Determined by the accepted students' availability

***If the student does not have their own cellphone, or tablet their parent or guardian can apply to ACP to see if they qualify to receive a free 4G Android phone or tablet with Wi-Fi.
